Karen is one of the most caring and optimist people you will meet. Armonie, the QIDP who found the map shares how Karen is always there to brighten her day. Karen loves making her cards. One really hit Armonie in the heart. It said simply, "Thank you for everything you do for me and Willow House". And it made all the difference in the world. This is what makes Karen special.
